WE ACCOMPLISH OUR MISSION THROUGH THREE PRIMARY METHODS:


Creating and producing diverse arts-based community festivals, programming, and events

SAACA & CREATIVE ARTS THERAPY

Facilitating the use of ground-breaking Creative Arts Therapies for seniors, Veterans, and individuals with disabilities in our community.

We believe that the arts can have an impact—physically, emotionally, economically, and educationally—on the lives of service members, Veterans, seniors, families, healthcare providers, and the community. Over the past year SAACA has launched an innovative Creative Arts Therapy

partnership program. The project aims to provide healing and quality of life support for trauma and recovery patients, individuals with disabilities, seniors and Military Veterans. The program utilizes a multidisciplinary arts integration method to provide healing through the arts with music, writing, visual arts and community arts integration mechanisms.

The program works directly with patients in care facilities, assisted living residences, rehabilitation facilities as well as Veterans homes and facilities throughout the region. Participants supported in the program are individuals who are coping with temporary and permanent disabilities related to post-traumatic stress disorder, memory care, depression and anxiety, aging and life transition support, rehabilitation and brain trauma injuries. Additionally, the program works directly with patients who are dealing with physical limitations including blind therapy, surgical and disease recovery, life threatening illnesses, mobility limitations and muscle diseases, as well as general aging limitation.

SIGNIFICANT PROGRAM ACHIEVEMENTS OF 2015

LAUNCHING THE MUSIC & MEMORY PROGRAM IN SOUTHERN ARIZONA

Thanks to generous support from Watermark Retirement Communities in partnership with the Southern Arizona Arts and Cultural Alliance. Patients enduring life-limiting illnesses are finding renewed joy and pleasure in rediscovering meaningful music through Music & Memory—a 501c3 non-profit organization that helps provide patients with individualized iPods loaded with personalized music playlists.

The Fountains at La Cholla is one of the first memory care communities in Southern Arizona to partner with SAACA on this revolutionary treatment program.

This past September, The Fountains at La Cholla launched the program as a year-long Creative Arts Therapy integration program. The program utilizes multi-disciplinary, arts-based programming to address physical, cognitive, and general aging related issues for resident and patients in the Tucson community. It is led by a team of dedicated staff members who converse with patients and/or families to determine which musical artists, songs, and genres will be most meaningful [and enjoyable] for the patient. Once the tailored playlist is created and downloaded onto an iPod, a SAACA staff member delivers the music to the patient and either listens along with him/her. or leaves the iPod for the individual to use independently or with family.

The idea is simple; however, the difference that Music & Memory is making in the quality of life of seriously ill people and their families is nothing short of remarkable. According to research, the therapeutic benefits of music can provide not only comfort and enjoyment, but also reduction of isolation, anxiety and agitation. Music also can help pain medication work more effectively and stimulate movement.

"Our partnership with Southern Arizona Arts and Cultural Alliances, SAACA, has brought us many talented artists in mediums such as art, music and writing. Most recently they have brought a wonderful program to our memory care community, The Gardens, the gift of personalized music. They interviewed the residents and came up with an iPod of music that they can listen to at any time. As soon as we turned on the music, everyone came alive! Some were tapping their feet along, singing, even dancing and some just a simple smile. All of these reactions were amazing to see especially with some of our more closed off residents. It is going to be so exciting to see how this music and the future music put on their iPod will bring new life to each of the residents! Thank you SAACA for bringing the

"The goal of this Creative Arts Therapy program is to improve quality of life, to provide life-long learning opportunities, and to utilize the arts with a therapeutic and healing impact," explained Kate Marquez, Executive Director of SAACA. Marquez was instrumental in launching a similar program at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Southern Arizona in 2014.

"Often in aging populations, fears of the future go unexpressed, causing stress. Through creative arts therapies, we work to give people an outlet to communicate their feelings while also encouraging them to discover joy in the present," said Marquez.

"As a company, we're committed to creating extraordinary communities where people thrive. We know physical wellness is only one piece of the pie. Emotional wellness is equally important to quality of life and Creative Arts Therapy can be a key contributor," said Richard Howell, Managing Director of Watermark Retirement Communities, operator of The Fountains at La Cholla.

VETERANS WRITING PROGRAM

There are over 157,974 veterans in Southern Arizona and approximately 20% of these Veterans have been diagnosed and are being treated for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). SAACA supports the emotional health of individuals suffering from PTSD and other traumatic brain injuries by introducing the arts as a positive vehicle for communication. Programs like Art Therapy aid in self-awareness, behavior improvement and addictions, and self-esteem.

Over the past year, SAACA has partnered with the Southern Arizona Veterans Administration on a collaborative arts project, utilizing creative writing and storytelling as the primary program approach, when working in the Polytrauma Veterans unit. Taught by local artist, and author Laila Halaby, the Creative Writing class administers exercises which employ all of the senses, often telling and writing stories with objects and pictures and working off other students' input and feedback. Each student comes in with a different goal (e.g. improved communication, honed writing skills for school, etc.) and the facilitator's job is to help each of them attain those goals through the various exercises and projects that we do.

This program has deeply impacted the lives of the Veterans participating in the program, and has utilized the creative arts as a profound mechanism for healing, coping and treating the often life changing effects that PTSD diagnosis can have in the lives of the families of Veterans. SAACA aims to expand the reach and depth of this program into new treatment areas and focuses that utilize creative writing and story telling in the treatment of Veterans in all walks of life.
